

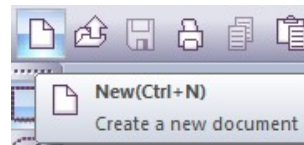
# Tone on Tone Wingding Flower Coat

Purchase a plain coat and make it spectacular by creating an exclusive flower with your computer's wingding font. Then embroider across the front of the coat and sleeve.



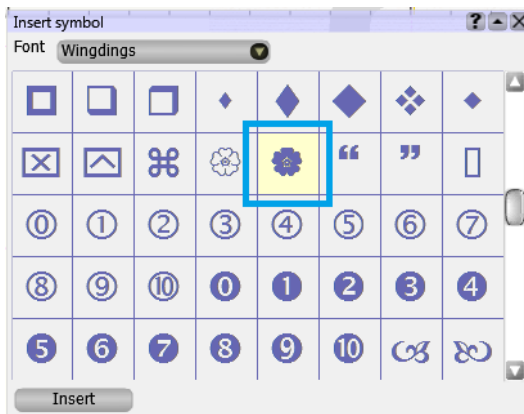
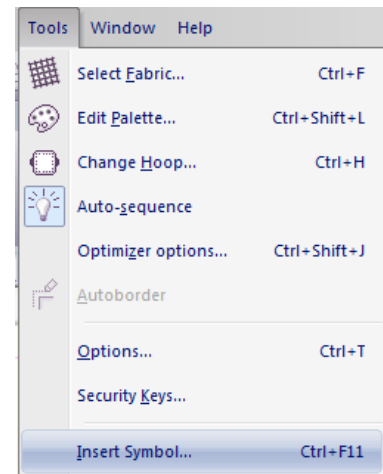
## Set up your design and stitching area

1. Create a New document.
2. Select New Graphic.
3. Choose the Generic 100 x 100 hoop. If you are using a different size hoop, adjust the amount of embroidery or the resizing as you put together your whole design. Next.
4. In the Fabric window, choose the proper weight of coat you will be using. In this lesson, we will be using Embroidery Heavy > Faille2. Choose a light color. Finish.



## Choose a Wingding

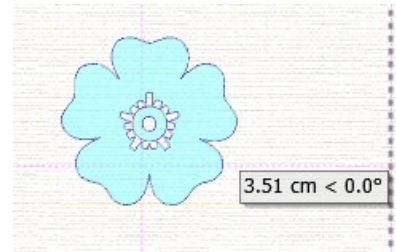
5. Click on Tools in the top Menu bar.
6. Move down and click on Insert Symbol. A new window appears.
7. Ensure that "Wingdings" is in the Font line.
8. Scroll down until you see the small filled in flower in the 12<sup>th</sup> row 5<sup>th</sup> column. Click on the flower.



9. Click Insert.

10. The mouse cursor has changed to a "+". Click and drag a flower onto your screen, in the hoop that is approximately 3.5 cm in size at approximately 0° angle.

*Don't worry if your size and angle are not exact. You should aim for close. If your flower is not exactly what you want it to be, Undo and repeat steps 9 and 10 again.*

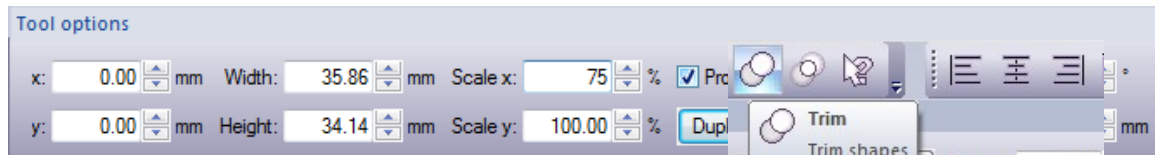


11. Close the Insert Symbol window.  
12. Move the flower to the center of the hoop area.

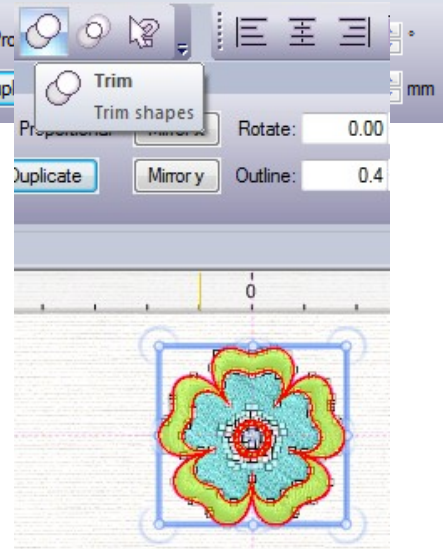
### Create one flower rings

13. Make sure the flower is selected. *If your flower does not have a box around it, either left click on the flower or click and drag a box around the whole flower.*

14. Duplicate the flower.  *Only click Duplicate ONCE! The new flower is directly on top of the original flower.*



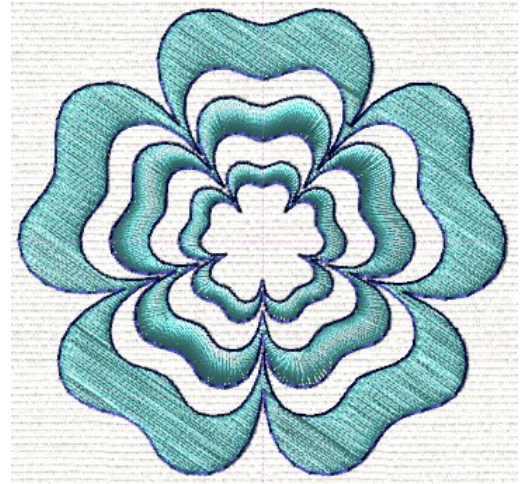
15. Change the Scale x: to 75% and make sure Proportional is checked. Press Enter. *Notice how the Duplicate flower is now smaller and directly on the original flower.*
16. With the smaller flower highlighted, hold the shift key on your keyboard and left click on the larger flower. *The smaller flower has a green line around it and the larger flower has a pink line around it.*
17. Move to the top menu bar and hover over the Trim tool. *See how the only the outer ring of the flower is yellow.* Click Trim.
18. Highlight the inner flower and press delete on the keyboard.
19. Click the remaining flower. Right click.
20. Click Break Apart in the window.
21. Click on the small round circle in the middle of the flower.



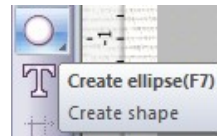
22. Press Delete on your keyboard.

### Construct the whole flower

23. Highlight the flower ring.
24. Duplicate.
25. Change the Scale x: to 55%. Make sure Proportional is checked. Enter.
26. Click on the larger ring again.
27. Duplicate.
28. Change the Scale x: to 160%. Make sure Proportional is checked. Enter.

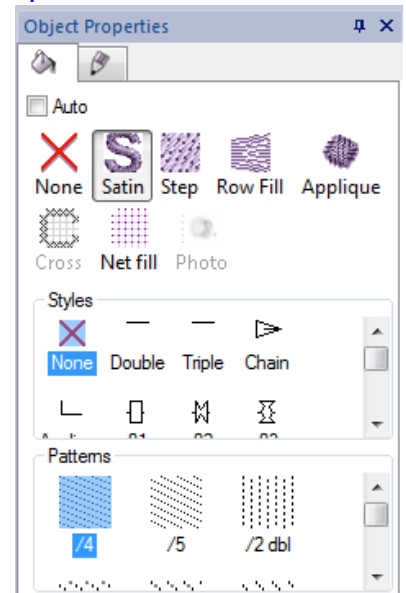



### Add finishing touches to your Flower



29. Click the Create Ellipse Shape tool. *If you do not see the Ellipse Shape, left click and hold your mouse on the Shape tool and the shapes fly out menu will appear. Click on the Ellipse.*
30. Left click and drag a small ellipse in the middle of your flower. Right click to end the tool.
31. Move the ellipse to the center of the flower.
32. Select the whole flower. *Click Ctrl+A on your keyboard as a shortcut to select everything on the screen.*
33. Click Satin in the Object Properties tool bar.
34. Choose Pattern 4.
35. Change the color of the flower to go with your jacket.
36. Adjust the outline color.
37. Change the Running Stitch to a Triple Stitch by

changing the Outline to 0.9 mm.
